Stokes stated that he has tried to push pickle ball on the course. He tried to change the parks plan and ad the Golf Course. If you want to get more help for this golf course. You got to get active with the whole Council, you will need at least five members on Council to listen.

Member Selby stated he would go speak to Council, the golf course is in great shape

Stokes stated put together a list of what is important to you and show what the cost will be and ask for a plan for the next budget.

Crann stated we have a budget worked out and he is not sure what happen.

Council Liaison Stokes stated come up with a reasonable plan and Council will review the plan. If you get this information added to the Budget it is easier to present this to Council.

Golf Advisory Report March 26, 2019 Agenda Item-New Business

4. A. State of the course

The Course conditions are good, Greens conditions are good although the thin areas are a concern, The rainy weather has affected the March revenues significantly. Superintendent Eric Oster has resigned his position effective March 29, he is moving on to another opportunity and we wish him well. Conditions change with weather and usage but customer response for the peak season has been excellent when the weather has been cooperative.

FY 19 Jan. Feb. total rounds (11,788) increased 4 rounds or were flat compared to FY 18 Total rounds for Jan and Feb (11,784) although total facility revenue FY 19 Jan. & Feb. (\$445,895) increased \$40,687 or 10.04 % compared to (\$405,208) same period.

Coral Oaks is participating in the PGA HOPE (Helping Our Patriots Everywhere) Program for the third consecutive year. The program is a nationwide initiative to introduce military veterans to the game and provide disabled veterans an outlet for some relief and enjoyment. We have 16 participants this year for the 6 - week program and the instructional sessions include all aspects of the game.

Coral Oaks has booked charity golf outings for April 6 - Gimmee Fore, 1 pm shotgun, Fri. Sat April 27 – Mariner High Boosters 8:30, May 4 – Knights of Columbus, All May events are Saturday 8:30 Shotguns.

Coral Oaks and the Cape Coral Junior Golf Association have received a gift from pheasant Cove outfitters to use as an organizational fundraiser and we have raised \$2000 for our 501 3 c scholarship program.

4. B Financial Update

Revenue & Expenditure figures are City of Cape Coral Finance, JDE Reports Now and Rec Trac FY 19 - Revenues - Oct.1 to Feb. 28 - \$1,165941 FY 19 - Expenditures - Oct.1 to Jan. 31. - \$820,690, February not posted in JDE

4. C Maintenance overview.

Superintendent Eric Oster will be leaving March 29. Eric has been instrumental in improving golf course conditions during his tenure and we wish him the best for his future. We will begin interviewing Superintendents as soon as possible.

Coral Oaks management team has completed our portion FY 20 to FY 22 budget. Long - term goals are to continue upgrading the golf course and amenities through the Asset Management Program. Cart Paths and proper greens irrigation are the most critical areas for needed improvements. Tree Trimming, Security cameras, parking lot and cart staging area resurfacing are immediate needs that are supplemental requests.

Tree trimming will be completed in April this year, which will alleviate turf - stress improve turf and tree health. Greens aerifications will begin in June with fairway aerifications beginning in May

4. D Marketing Programs.

Coral Oaks weekend special of \$55 dollars from 11 am to 2 pm has been a success. This year's booking rate exceeded 90% fill rate. Television ads ran for the first time in many years and while we do not track the ads whenever they run we see increases and get more calls. Radio Ads also ran during February and March promoting Coral Oaks facility amenities and weekend specials. Social media, newsletters, and e-blasts work well for us.
