

B2B ASSISTANCE PROGRAM CRA MEETING DECEMBER 4, 2024



OBJECTIVE

Amend CRA Resolution 2-23 Establishing the Breaking Barriers to Business Grant to add Building Code and Fire Code improvements

- a. Meet challenges unique to small businesses in the Downtown Cape.
- b. Assist businesses with extraneous costs designed to enhance infrastructure and public improvements



WHY?

- I. Some provisions of the Land Development Code trigger significant fees that are cost prohibitive to development.
- II. Unexpected costs can discourage businesses from making quality investments that create the atmosphere desired for the Downtown Cape
- III. Change of uses often trigger requirements to make building improvements to meet Fire Code.



ASSISTANCE GUIDELINES

- A. Assistance provided for expenses incurred as a result of permitting and land development requirements.—as part of the permit review process to meet the requirements of land development, building and fire code.
- B. Businesses making a minimum \$25,000 investment in building and site improvements are eligible.
- C. Businesses will receive a grant equal to 20% of total project investment at the site, excluding cost of equipment.
- D. City will reimburse up to 50% of <u>required</u> land improvement and development costs; and impact and permit fees, at an amount not to exceed \$50,000.
- E. Expenses eliligible for reimbursement: parking lots, sidewalks, landscaping, and right-of way improvements

ASSISTANCE GUIDELINES

- E. Eligible expenditures: Eligible expenditures to be paid from the Breaking Barriers to Business (B2B) Grant Program include the following:
 - 1. Land improvement and development costs, including infrastructure design and construction, road improvements required by new construction on on-site improvement, landscaping and road beautification costs, water and sewer connection fees, telecommunication connection fees and costs, drainage facilities in conjunction with new construction or on-site improvements, construction of new curbs, curb cuts, medians, shoulders, and sidewalks, relocating utilities to accommodate new construction or on-site improvements, fire sprinklers, and other types of site development and building improvement expenses that may be approved by the City
