What is it?

## WHAT IS IT?

- Oasis Woods is a Pine
  Flatwoods ecosystem which is
  primarily dominated by
  Southern Slash Pine trees and
  ephemeral ponds
- I am not positive, but I would estimate it to cover somewhere around 50 acres, maybe more.
- Very unique and rare systems in South Florida, flooded part of the year, completely dry during others

## WHAT IS OUT THERE?

- Variety of invertebrates
- Threatened Gopher Tortoises live on edge of woods
- Burrowing Owls have been seen along edge, also threatened
- Nesting pair of Bald Eagles
- Spiders, Frogs, Snakes, Hawks, woodpeckers, raccoon (tracks), opossum (tracks), variety of butterflies as well as some of their host plants. And much more!



### WHAT HAVE WE DONE WITH IT?

- I have brought classes out there to teach certain aspects of:
  - The atmosphere
  - Local plant identification
  - Evolution
  - Many other lessons.
- After I initially cleared some trails for classes, JROTC used it for their training as well
- We have walked it multiple times per class. Very interesting to walk through an area that is so drastically different throughout the year.

- Important to say that many kids did not want to go, but an alternative lengthy assignment, sounded less fun I guess.

- Just as an oasis within a desert. Oasis woods is a natural area many organisms, who could not survive in Cape Coral Neighborhoods, are able to survive, being surrounded by thousands of houses and miles of streets.

  - Scientific studies
  - Restore/Rehab ponds to attract wildlife
  - Bird watching
  - Invasive removal
  - Boardwalk so everyone can enjoy!



### WHAT IS A FOCUS GROUP?

- A <u>process</u> to collect information through a group discussion based on a set of questions.
- Uses a moderator (or facilitator) that follows a <u>predetermined</u> interview guide (scripted).
- Small groups generally between 5 12
- Collects information about a group's <u>perception</u>, <u>attitude</u> or <u>experience</u> on defined topics.

## HOW DOES A FOCUS GROUP WORK?



### **ADVANTAGES OF FOCUS GROUPS**

- Provides insights not just what you think but why
- Reveal consensus and diversity of participants' perceptions
- Allows group interactions to build on each other's ideas
- Provide opportunity to explore reasons behind the response

## DISADVANTAGES OF FOCUS GROUPS

- Groups are small extra work representative
- Generates <u>lots</u> of information difficult to analyze
- Information can be biased by subjective interpretations
- Outspoken individuals can dominate the discussion

## HOW WE MANAGE FOCUS GROUPS

- Mix of questions general and more specific include follow up probes
- Select group members who represent the target population
- Limit size of group to 5 12 smaller groups
- No need to do a lot of focus groups (4 6)
- Good note keeping
- Recording sessions
- Preparation and follow up analysis takes most time
