Golf Advisory Report March 27, 2018 Agenda Item-New Business

#### 4. A. State of the course

The Course conditions are good, Greens conditions are good to excellent. The cold weather has affected the color of the golf course and heavy traffic has created some worn areas. Conditions change with weather and usage but customer response for the peak season has been excellent.

FY 18 Total rounds for Jan and Feb (11,688) decreased 488 rounds or 4.0% compared to FY 17 Jan. Feb. (12.176) although Greens Fee and Cart Fee revenues FY 18 Jan. Feb. (\$506,549) increased \$17,221 or 3.5% compared to FY 17 Jan. Feb. (\$489, 328). Taking into consideration that one local competitor was closed during this same time frame last year the loss of rounds equates to 8.2 per day. The loss of customers is minimal with a new opening.

Coral Oaks provided tee time surveys to customers over a month - long period to monitor pace of play issues. The results of the surveys were not completed at report time. Last year's results were 4 hours 21 minutes. These surveys will continue during peak periods in the future and have been effective by making customers aware the importance on pace of play. Our goal is for everyone's round to be enjoyable and having players be aware and considerate of all others playing on the course.

Coral Oaks is participating in the PGA HOPE (Helping Our Patriots Everywhere) Program for the second consecutive year. The program is a nationwide initiative to introduce military veterans to the game and provide disabled veterans an outlet for some relief and enjoyment. We have 15 participants this year for the 6 - week program and the instructional sessions include all aspects of the game.

Coral Oaks will be converting to the USGA GHIN Handicap and Tournament Software in early June 2018. The cost will be \$20 + tax per player but will not be charged until their handicap renewal date. The licensing for the current Golf Net handicap and tournament program has changed and created the need for this conversion.

Coral Oaks has booked charity golf outings for April 7 - Gimmee Fore 1 pm shotgun, Fri. April 13 – Cape Coral Chamber of Commerce 8:30 am, Sat April 28 – Mariner High Boosters 8:30, May 5 – Knights of Columbus, May 12 PBA Spartans Travel Baseball, May 19 – Goodwill, May 26 – A Round for Rogo. All May events are Saturday 8:30 Shotguns.

Coral Oaks and the Cape Coral Junior Golf Association have received a gift from Pheasant Cove Outfitters to use as an organizational fundraiser. The goal will be to raise \$10,000 for Junior Golf.

Coral Oaks, Manager / Head Golf Professional was awarded the Southwest Florida Chapter PGA Junior Golf Leader award. Although the award is given to an individual it is the Cape Coral Junior Golf Association and the Coral Oaks Junior Golf Programs that are truly deserving of the award.

#### 4. C Maintenance overview.

Coral Oaks management team has completed our portion FY 19 to FY 21 budget. Long - term goals are to continue upgrading the golf course and amenities through the Asset Management Program. Cart Paths and proper greens irrigation are the most critical areas for needed improvements. Tree Trimming, Security cameras, parking lot and cart staging area resurfacing are immediate needs that are supplemental requests.

Tree trimming was completed in March, canopies were raised on many holes with some tress removed for turf health or tree health. Greens aerifications will begin in June with fairway aerifications beginning in May

### 4. D Marketing Programs.

All Coral Oaks weekend special of \$55 dollars from 11 am to 2 pm has been a success 1899 tee times were filled out of a possible 2420. This is an 80% fill rate. While that seems poor for peak season weekend play is normally a 50% fill rate Radio Ads ran during February and March promoting Coral Oaks renovations and weekend specials. Social media, newsletters, and e-blasts work well for us.
