Ordinance 56-24 Public Hearing

WHAT THE ORDINANCE ACCOMPLISHES:

An ordinance of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Cape Coral, Florida, amending Article 5, Development Standards, Chapter 4, Marine Improvements, Section 5.4.7., Boat Canopies and Sun Shelters, of the Land Development Code of the City of Cape Coral, Florida, regarding boat canopies. (Brought forward by Councilmember Steinke)

City Planning Staff Recommendation: Approval Planning and Zoning Recommendation: Approval

City Clerk Bruns read the title of the Ordinance.

Senior Planner Santora explained the following changes to the existing Ordinance:

- Minor modification to the Boat Canopy Land Development Code Section
- Specifically amending two sections
- One regarding overall height raising it slightly
- Other section being revised to provide for one additional canopy on properties that were over 80 feet waterfront and providing a max area cap
- Same language presented at the October 23rd COW
- Staff provided sketches illustrating different plot configurations and the amount of canopy that would be permitted

Councilmember Steinke moved, seconded by Councilmember Carr, to adopt Ordinance 56-24, as presented.

<u>Councilmember Steinke</u> thanked Staff for the illustrations provided.

Originally, it was slated to be for December 4th Regular Council Meeting so the new Councilmembers would have an opportunity to weigh in on this topic.
